### Background

The Regional Universities Forum for Capacity Building in Agriculture (RUFORUM)<sup>1</sup> will hold its 15<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting in Cape Coast, Ghana on 2-6 December 2019. This is the first time the AGM is being held in West Africa and offers renewed commitment to strengthening higher agricultural education, science, technology and innovation in Africa. The overall theme of the 15<sup>th</sup> AGM is to *Delivering on Africa's Universities Agenda for Agricultural Higher Education, Science, Technology and Innovation (AHESTI):* What will it take?.

This year's AGM is special in two ways: First, it is the first time since RUFORUM's creation to be hosted in West Africa following the strategic geographical expansion in 2014 to collaborate with Universities and partners in Benin, Ghana, Mali, Nigeria, and Senegal. This meeting therefore presents an opportunity for RUFORUM network to show case its benefit to Higher Education landscape in West Africa and bring on board key strategic partners in West Africa. Secondly, the AGM coincides with RUFORUM's 15th anniversary as a network, a year after a year after the ratification of the RUFORUM Vision 2030 strategy and its Operational Plan 2018-2022. During the AGM meetings, RUFORUM shall be consolidating

achievements, reflecting and learning from implementing the programmes for the past 15 years and forge/envision how to move forward with the new Vision 2030.

The meeting will bring together over 400 delegates from across Africa and beyond including Ministers of Agriculture; Higher Education and Training; Finance; Science, Technology and Innovation and their respective Permanent Secretaries/Chief Directors; Vice-Chancellors/Presidents/Rectors; Principals and Deans; Heads of development institutions, private sector leaders; farmers and farmer representatives; emerging and early career researchers and young entrepreneurs from especially Ghana and other West African countries; and other key invited stakeholders.

Several key sessions will be hosted during this year's AGM. However, the opening ceremony has been slated for afternoon of 5<sup>th</sup> December 2019. There will be recognition awards for outstanding educationists who have made significant contribution to higher education in Africa. Over the years, RUFORUM Board decided to periodically recognize individuals who have made significant contribution to Africa, in various capacities including leadership and institutional management, or research and teaching excellence and service to society. Separately, a recognition award will be given to the Government of Ghana for its exemplary support to the education sector in Ghana and for promoting Pan-Africanism.

Specifically, the objectives of the opening ceremony are:

- 1. Recognise the contribution of the Government of Ghana to Higher Education in Ghana, RUFORUM and Africa at large.
- 2. Recognise individuals who have made a significant contribution to the higher education sector in Africa.
- 3. Advocate for policy engagement to strengthen higher agricultural education, science, technology and innovation in Africa.
- 4. Galvanise the higher education sector in support of national development priorities and the African Union Agenda 2063.

#### **Meeting Approach**

In this meeting, key higher Education stakeholders, Ministers, will give keynote addresses at galvanizing support to strengthen agricultural higher education, science and Technology. This will be followed an overview to the Launch of Prof. Adipala Ekwamu's Memoirs "The Unfinished Journey". Recognition awards to be handed to four outstanding educationists who have made significant contribution to the higher education sector in Africa, and another award to the Government of Ghana for its immense contribution to Pan-Africanism and support to higher education development in Africa. His Excellency Nana Addo Dankwa Akufo-Addo, President of the Republic of Ghana will grace the official opening of the AGM. He will deliver the official AGM opening addresses on galvanizing intra-country and intra-regional cooperation in the field of Higher and Tertiary Education in Africa. This will be followed by an official photograph session with the President and thereafter, a cocktail function hosted by the Government of Ghana to crown the day's activities.
