AGM OVERVIEW

he RUFORUM Annual General Meeting (AGM) is a platform for reviewing Network operations and receiving guidance from its governance organs, and stakeholders. During the AGM, the Network also reviews its technical delivery and engagements through a scientific session that includes, presentations. poster sessions and exhibitions. Additionally, capacity development activities are undertaken and recognition across different levels of delivery are made. The AGM is hosted on a rotational basis by member universities and their respective countries. The AGM is the supreme decision-making organ of the Network that brings universities. together member policy makers and partners to prioritise, seek guidance, share experiences and lessons on building Africa's human capital, generation of Science Technology and Innovation and relevant policy information to underpin development on the continent. In 2023. RUFORUM will hold its 19th AGM, hosted by the Government of the Republic of Cameroon and member universities in Cameroon from 28 October to 2 November 2023 in Yaoundé, Cameroon,

The 19th RUFORUM AGM is held under the patronage of His Excellence Paul Biya, Head of State and President of the Republic of Cameroon. The theme of the 19th AGM is "Transforming Higher Education to Sustainably Feed and Create Prosperity for Africa," and it brings together Agriculture and Higher Education Ecosystem actors, Governments, development partners and key stake holders to engage in discussions that enhance Higher Agricultural and Tertiary Education in Africa.

During the AGM, the August Assembly will:

- Provide a forum for the RUFORUM Governance organs and Stakeholders to reflect on progress made on the implementation of various transformative training, research and development programmes of the Network;

This year's AGM will consist of different convenings. These include pre-AGM events, side events, the Business Meeting, capacity building and mentoring sessions, scientific conference, poster sessions and exhibitions by member universities and other partners. Additionally high-level policy dialogues with Ministers, Senior Government Leaders and Development Partners will be held.



elcome the 19th to Regional Universities Forum for Capacity Agriculture Buildina in General (RUFORUM) Annual Meeting (AGM) hosted by Cameroon in the nation's capital city of Yaoundé, at Palais des Congrès. This is the first time that such a meeting is held in Central Africa and we are honoured to host you all. This year's AGM is held under the Distinguished Patronage of His Excellency Paul Biya, Head of State and President of the Republic of Cameroon. The AGM is co-hosted by RUFORUM's five member universities in Cameroon. namely The University of Bamenda, University of Buea, University of Dschang, University of Ngaoundéré and University of Maroua.

Since our last meeting in Harare Zimbabwe, our world has continued to make progress and at the same time, faced a number of development challenges. Externalities such as the Russia-Ukraine war, inflation and local issues such as political instability, and increased occurrence of climate induced environmental challenges continue to affect recovery from post- covid economic

challenges. At the beginning of 2023, Africa's economy was projected to grow at 4.1% but is now projected to decelerate below the 2022 level of 3.6 %. Climate change has played a major role, affecting agriculture the livelihood and economic engine for many countries. The African Development Bank, estimates loses of 5 to 15% of Africa's annual GDP per capita growth to climate change related phenomena. These and headwinds have implications on what we do as a continent, and importantly, as the agriculture higher education and research for development subsector

I must note however, that all is not bad for Africa with inflation steadily easing from 9.3% in 2022 to 7.3% in 2023 and fiscal balances improving in many countries. Further, reports show that this year the Eastern African community will grow by 4.9%, while the West African Economic and Monetary Union will grow by 5.1%. Converselv. Africa's Food Security situation is a mixed bag of improvement and challenges. This year Southern Africa has reported surplus-production across its major food basket countries and stabilizing prices for staple grains. Eastern Africa has experienced extreme weather events increasing food insecurity, with nearly 37.26 million people facing acute food insecurity.


West and Central Africa have similarly been affected by extreme weather the situation exacerbated by political instability in key food basket countries. Clearly, a combination of natural occurrences for which science can offer solutions, and socio-economic issues, for which solid political-economy actions at the national, regional, and global levels can offer solutions are needed.

Africa's higher education sector must remain in synchrony with its population growth, and the future of jobs trends. The World Bank estimates Africa's gross tertiary education enrolment at 9.4%, growing at 15% annually. Tertiary education enrolment across Africa is however varied, with some countries such as Mauritius recording enrolment of 40%, Ghana and Togo 15%, while Niger records 4.4 %. Moreover, investments, expertise and contribution to knowledge by African higher education and research sector are generally lower than the rest of the world, but annually growing at 3.2%.

The scope for improvement exists and as a network we can leverage on each other's strength to grow.

Dear delegates, this AGM could not have happened at a more opportune time. The theme of this year's AGM Higher Transforming Education to Sustainably Feed and Create Prosperity for Africa speaks to our imperative as a sector in developing Africa. Gathered here are Students, Academics, Scientists, Policy Makers, Finance Institutions, Development Practitioners. the Private Sector. Public and Quasi-Public institutions to discuss, engage and partner. It is our collective response to the clarion call from Africa and the World for African academic and research institutions and their partners, to generate solutions that will foster steady progress and usher in a better future for humanity. I wish you all happy and productive meeting engagements. I thank you.

Message from the RUFORUM Executive Secretary

t is that time of year again, when the Regional Universities Forum for Capacity Building in Agriculture (RUFORUM) brings us all together. Welcome to the 19th Annual General Meeting (AGM) of RUFORUM. This year, we are hosted by the West and Central Africa region, for the first time, by Cameroon under the Distinguished Patronage of His Excellency Paul Biya, Head of State and President of the Republic of Cameroon. We deeply thank the Government and people of Cameroon as well as our hosts the five RUFORUM member universities in Cameroon, that is, University of Bamenda, University of Ngaoundere, University of Dschang, University of Buea and University of Maroua, for tirelessly working to host us all. Merci beaucoup, thank you very much.

The theme of this year's AGM is "Transforming Higher Education to Sustainably Feed and Create Prosperity for Africa." This theme is informed by a number important mutually interacting factors that collectively, are affecting the growth and progress of the continent. The economic outlook for our continent in 2023 by the African Development Bank and other global apex development financial institutions was positive. However, Africa's economic growth has since then deaccelerated. and is now projected to be lower than the previously projected rate of 4.1%. Agriculture a key sector, continues to be affected by both natural and human induced factors. However, compared to growth produced in other parts of the economy, growth in agriculture is two to three times more successful reducing poverty. Agriculture continues to face serious threats from climate. Studies by the United Nation's Convention to Combat Desertification show that Africa accounts for all 44 % severe droughts recorded globally in the last 50 years, causing economic losses of more than USD70 billion. In 2022. an estimated loss of US\$ 8.5 billion in economic damages was experienced due to climate change.

Clearly, climate change and weather variability, remains one of the grand challenges of the 21st century for

Africa and the World, because it affects key livelihood and strategic areas of emerging economies. Unemployment facing Africa's dominant demographic the youth, raises questions about education, skilling and jobs creation. While inclusion and diversity, the underpinning for an equal society, remains challenging. The question then to academia. researchers. development practitioners and policy is, "what steps must we take right now to address the challenges to our current and future generations?" Our resounding response as RUFORUM is in line with what Malcolm X said many years ago, "education and research for development are the passports to the future, for tomorrow belongs to those who prepare for it today." This AGM is therefore organised around four thematic areas that capture key actions needed to engage students, academics, scientists, policy makers, institutions. development finance practitioners, private sector, public and quasi-public institutions and other education ecosystem actors in generating solutions for contemporary development our challenges. The themes are:

 Theme 1. Africa's new harvest: Preparing Africa's agriculture and related sectors to feed and grow the continent's economy. This covers (a) Regenerative agriculture that addresses how to sustainably increase production and productivity; (b) Reducing food losses, evening food supply; (c) Africa's blue economy.

- 2. **Theme 2.** Accelerating and scaling-up Africa's climate change adaptation and mitigation actions: Experiences and lessons learned. covers climate change mitigation and adaptation actions required to secure agriculture and related sectors of the economy.
- 3. **Theme 3.** Access, equity and quality of African Higher and Tertiary Education. This covers (a) Transformative education, (b) strengthening work transitions for Africa's youth and Leveraging local capacity for building capacity.
- 4. Theme 4. Accelerating economic growth: trends, youth, policv practice and futures. Theme four undertakes critical analysis of key development areas and the data thereof to inform discussions on the prospects for faster and justifiable economic growth and poverty reduction actions and Topical areas policy. include: Smallholder agriculture: Can it feed and grow Africa? It also includes case studies on enhancing value chain functionality and review of continental initiatives among others.

The AGM will also bring together key policy makers and development actors who will meet to review and discuss efforts needed to accelerate investments for transforming higher

agricultural education in Africa. Discussions on strategic partnerships between Africa's apex bodies and their key partners for agricultural research, education and outreach/ last mile delivery will be held, including meetings of the African Union (AU)-European Union (EU) International Research Consortium (IRC) platform. RUFORUM Statutory meetings and The Cameroon Higher Education Day and training of staff and students, take place prior to commencement of the scientific conference. The scientific sessions will be held through plenary and parallel sessions designed for everyone to participate. This includes poster and exhibition sessions that will run through-out the conference, but premiered on the first day of the meeting. The entire AGM is designed as a blended (in-person and virtual) meeting. This AGM also provides time for networking with most sessions ending at 16:30 hours, in the early evening.

On behalf of the RUFORUM network and the local organizing committee I hope that you all enjoy the exciting speakers and sessions to come. I further hope that you the audience and participants take something away from the event to meet your mission of serving humanity. I thank you and welcome to Cameroon.
