Background

Globally, the world is undergoing a period of dramatic change with the transition from an industrial-based to a knowledge-based economy, as well as technological advances, fiscal challenges of higher education, and cultural shifts in society as a whole. Increasing collaborations between communities and universities in order to influence the public good becomes paramount during this time of dramatic change. As frustratingly slow as the movement to strengthen the relationship between higher education and society sometimes seems to be, few social institutions are better situated than colleges and universities to stimulate significant community improvement. Individually and collectively, institutions of higher education possess considerable resources—human, fiscal, organizational, and intellectual—which are critical to addressing significant social issues¹.

Despite having enormous capacities and resources, higher education institutions individually cannot singularly realise development impacts but require operating in a connected world with unprecedented collaborations within and across the spectrum. As a result, the importance of cross-border, inter-institutional collaborations has grown because of the expansion of global higher education teaching and research capacity as well as the emergence of more strategic and comprehensive forms of higher education internationalisation and the increased need for universities to deliver development outcomes².

The Regional Universities Forum for Capacity Building in Agriculture (RUFORUM), a consortium of 163 universities from across Africa is a dynamic network of universities that has been central to strengthening collaborations and partnerships among universities and universities with education and agricultural ecosystem stakeholders. RUFORUM offers opportunity for both agricultural and education ecosystem stakeholders to develop a cost effective way to enhance capacity in the higher education marketplace as well as to extend institutional reach and stature nationally and regionally. Through, network universities are in position to increase their stature including internationalisation and quality academic programs.

Purpose and Objectives

International, regional and national collaboration has become integral to higher education in the 21st century, and perhaps nowhere is this more apparent than in the recent proliferation of international partnerships among colleges and universities. RUFORUM represents that dynamic network of partners that brings convergence of agricultural higher education institutions from across Africa. The overarching goal of this 23rd Technical Committee and TAGDev Steering Committee meeting is to deliberate the reformed future of RUFORUM programming for efficiency, and effectiveness. The specific objectives are:

- 1. Re-define a futuristic RUFORUM programming architecture that delivers for impact with efficiency and effectiveness.
- 2. Receive, review and provide technical guidance to RUFORUM's operational programs to ensure alignment to establish norms and principles.
- 3. Receive and provide technical guidance to programs under design.
