BACKGROUND

The AU-EU Senior Officials Meeting (SOM) under the aegis of the AU-EU HLPD adopted in 2016, their common first ten-year (2016-2026) roadmap towards a Research and Innovation (R&I) partnership on Food and Nutrition Security and Sustainable Agriculture (FNSSA). Four research and innovation priorities were funded under the first FNSSA Roadmap for Research and Innovation (R&I) as follows:

- i) Sustainable Intensification;
- ii) Agriculture and food systems for nutrition;
- iii) Expansion and improvement of agricultural markets and trade and
- iv) Crosscutting issues (improved coordination between European and African FNSSA R&I projects, supporting innovation processes, strengthening collaborative capacities of R&I communities, and social and cultural contexts of FNSSA production systems).

The FNSSA roadmap was largely informed by the EU strategy and the Comprehensive Africa Agricultural Development Programme (CAADP). It defined the AU-EU common R&I priorities

within the FNSSA domain. Under the leadership of the HLPD, the implementation of the Roadmap has galvanized a growing FNSSA Partnership chaperoned by the HLPD FNSSA Working Group.

The 2016-2026 FNSSA Roadmap coming to an end in 2026, the AU-EU partnership approved the "Consortium Europe Africa on Research and Innovation for Food Systems Transformation (CEA-FIRST) "project financing, which aims among others, to develop a new R&I Roadmap on FNSSA for the upcoming ten year (2027-2037). CEA FIRST as the first bi-continental effort (in scope and scale) also aims to operationalize the International Research Consortium (IRC) on FNSSA, in line with the FNSSA roadmap of the AU-EU High Level Policy Dialogue (HLPD). The project started in December 2023 and was funded by the European Commission through the Horizon Europe R&I Program (Cluster 6).

CEA-FIRST Project will be delivered through the implementation of the following seven work packages:

As part of the activities under WP2 - Consolidation of Knowledge Management and Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning tools to support the FNSSA Roadmap update", the project will support the update of the 2016-2026 FNSSA Roadmap with new Research and Innovation priorities to guide the AU-EU R&I investments for the period 2027-2037. The updating of the 2016 -2026 FNSSA roadmap to develop the new roadmap for the 2027 to 2037 period required desk-reviews of the eight-year implementation of the first roadmap and on-line surveys which the project implemented and generated various outputs such as (i) Key successes, level of achievement of the expected outcomes and the impact achieved by the R&I projects, programs and policies implemented in the four thematic areas of the 2016-2026 Roadmap; (ii) areas of improvement identified, and (iii) emerging FNSSA R&I priorities, challenges and future prospects also identified.

RUFORUM, CIRAD and project partners seeks to enrich the above outputs by obtaining feedback from all stakeholders in the FNSSA domain but also their inputs and suggestions for the 2027-

2037 FNSSA Roadmap. Both the EU Strategy and the CAADP Malabo agenda identify research communities as having a leading role to play.

The CEA-FIRST project also aims to develop participatory Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning (MEL) frameworks for the International Research Consortium and the FNSSA partnership. The MEL frameworks and ensuing data collection and analysis systems will enable the IRC to monitor and evaluate the progress of the FNSSA Partnership and the IRCs impact on its membership.

From August 12th to 16th, The Regional Universities Forum for Capacity Building will hold its second triennial scientific conference in Windhoek, Namibia under the overarching theme "Operationalising Higher Agricultural Education and Research Ecosystems for Innovation, Industrialisation and Economic Development in Africa: A Call for Action". The conference will bring together over 1,000 delegates involved in the agricultural research and innovation landscape in Africa and beyond. The conference therefore provides a good platform for CEA FIRST project to organise a side event with beneficiaries and stakeholders to become aware of the planned IRC and give input towards its operationalization and at a higher level to inform the updating of the 2027 – 2037 FNSSA roadmap.

OVERALL OBJECTIVE

The objective is to build dialogue between African universities and research institutions on the IRC that is expected to play a role as the main AU-EU Platform of the FNSSA partnership for building sustainable and responsive food systems, economic growth and job creation. In addition, the event aims to facilitate stakeholder inputs into strategic activities for operationalization of the IRC.

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

- 1. Create awareness amongst stakeholders about the International Research Consortia and mobilise membership for the platform.
- 2. To facilitate stakeholder input towards the impact oriented desk review and preliminary results of the implementation of the AU-EU R&I FNSSA Roadmap (2016-2026) and provision of input into the new 2027-2037 FNSSA Roadmap.
- 3. To facilitate participatory development of the IRC and FNSSA Partnership Monitoring, Evaluation and Learning (MEL) frameworks

APPROACH

The workshop will consider a blended approach (both physical and virtual attendance). There will be plenary PowerPoint presentations followed by discussions. Breakout sessions will be organized to collect more inputs and recommendations of the stakeholders. Breakout sessions participants will report back in plenary.
