## **Background**

The landscape of education in Africa is rapidly transforming due to advancements in digital technologies and a growing demand for accessible and inclusive learning opportunities. As Africa strives to meet sustainable development goals, education becomes essential in fostering innovation, industrialization, and economic growth. E-learning has emerged as a critical tool to expand educational access, especially in areas with limited infrastructure.

The 2024 RUFORUM Triennial Conference, themed "Operationalising Higher Agricultural Education and Research Ecosystems for Innovation, Industrialisation and Economic Development in Africa: A Call for Action," offers an ideal platform to discuss and promote e-learning initiatives. The side event on "Strengthening E-LEARNING FOR INCLUSION," aims to bring together stakeholders from various sectors to explore the potential of e-learning in creating inclusive educational opportunities and driving sustainable development.
